Sneem Development Committee have grave concerns regarding lack of housing for all year round rental accommodation and also social housing in our beautiful village. It has come to our attention that growing families will have to leave our village if they cannot get a suitable family home. We are looking for property owners to get in contact with us if you have 4 and 5 bedroomed houses that you are willing to rent under the County Council Scheme.

We also need all of the community to come on board and help us lobby the County Council to put in place a plan for our future. The very important part of this project is that there are more names put on the County Council Housing list. The application process can be daunting but we are here to help in a confidential and clear way. We are looking at the bigger picture here, we know that there are young families forced to live elsewhere because of the lack of housing, this is a serious matter, as it will have a 'domino' effect on the village's facilities such as the crèche and the school.

## **Sneem Walking Club prepares for Brexit at AGM**

The Taoiseach, Leo Varadkar and Tánaiste, Simon Coveney are amongst many politicians who request all Irish Businesses and Organisations to prepare for Brexit. At its AGM in October Sneem Walking Club (SWC) drafted its own "Brexit" Plan; just like many other businesses we have to prepare for Brexit said the re-elected Chair of SWC, Mossie Walsh. The first action of the plan, which is to be enshrined in our constitution, should be that non-native Sneemites are and will always be welcome to join the walking club. If you are from Cork, Limerick or Dublin, even from overseas (including England) you will be welcome. We have many Sneem residents / regular visitors in the Club but more members would add to the enjoyment of the walks and club activities (OK maybe a few extra pints and the craic). If you visit Sneem, live or work here, consider joining SWC.

The second action, which was proposed by the re-elected Treasurer, Nick Heffernan, was to hold the membership fee at €30 per year. Tight fiscal control has led to a small increased surplus said Nick and some good deal negotiating by Maura O'Brien with Teddy McCarthy has kept transport costs at a minimum. It's important to keep control over costs said Nick and by keeping the membership fee relatively low (the fee mainly covers walkers insurance via Mountaineering Ireland Membership), it ensures good value for money. SWC is prepared for harder financial times.

Walks undertaken by the Club vary from easy (i.e. not too much of a hill to climb) of 2-3 hours to very challenging walks of 6-7 hours. Mossie proposed thanks to the 2018 walk leaders Michael Joe Murphy (aka the Quiet Man), Billy Mahony (aka the Bull), Maura O'Brien (aka the Queen of the Hills) and Nick Heffernan (aka the Chancellor).

This "Brexit" Plan, at the suggestion of Michele Cooper-Fay (a new member) and Olive Quinlan (elected Vice Secretary) will include more diverse walks in 2019 to cater for more recreational walkers; under consideration are: Island walks, Garden walks, History walks, Geology walks, Nature walks and so on. Increased diversification of walks should bring in new members and increase solidarity in the event Brexit actually happens!

Recognising the Brexiters want new trade deals with the USA, Sonny Looney (a long term member of the Club), suggested that the JFK 50 Mile Challenge be cancelled. In its place and allowable under EU rules the Club would have another type of Charity Walk organised solely by the Club, with sponsorship proceeds going to local charities. Also under consideration is the "Night into Day" annual walk. Further details will follow.

Other Club members have started looking further afield for walks including Alaska (Liz and Sean McCarthy), Belgium and France (Laurence and Jochen), Iceland (Mary and Noelie), Germany (Fergal Harrington) and Australia (Margaret Christian, Don Keogh and Dave Fay). As part of the "Brexit" Plan members are asked to suggest walks (but preferably not as far away as Australia or Alaska) that we could plan for 2019. J V O'Sullivan, a founder member of the Club, provided the "Brexit" Plan with its final action:

"If and when Brexit happens things will be different in Sneem"..... but sure haven't they always been?

## WWI Memorial

A day never to be forgotten by those who attended the unveiling of the Memorial Plaque to those that served in World War I. On Sunday November 11<sup>th</sup>, the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Armistice Day that ended World War I, the local men and women who served in that conflict were honoured in Sneem and in all parishes in the Iveragh Peninsula. Proceedings began in Sneem at St Michael's Church where a large crowd attended a mass in honour of those who served.

A beautiful service was presided over by Fr. Liam O'Brien. Fr. O'Brien read out the names of the nine local men who lost their lives between 1914 and 1918. Immediately after Mass proceedings got underway for the unveiling ceremony. This began with Eddie Mulcahy playing the bagpipes as he marched from the church gate up to the corner where the plaque was unveiled. Eddie was followed by some of the close family members of the soldiers named on the plaque. They in turn were followed by scouts and scout leaders. Vincent O'Leary addressed the crowd by welcoming everybody. The names of the nine local men were read by nine scouts as Eddie Mulcahy played "Lord Lovat's Lament".

Denis Riordan and Noreen Morris (nee Nash) – niece and grandnephew of John Nash, and Mary O'Shea – grandniece of John Finnegan, unveiled the plaque. As this was taking place, the skies opened with a deluge of hail and rain, creating a backdrop reminiscent of the conditions suffered by those fallen men, as they lay in the trenches at the Battle of the Somme and elsewhere in Europe during World War I. As the deluge continued the large crowd stood their ground, some in water inches deep and flowing through their Sunday shoes. This alone showed their respect for the fallen soldiers, which was well overdue.

Denis Riordan, nephew of John Nash, who had travelled from Boston with family especially for the occasion, gave a profound speech on how John and a small part of his regiment got separated from the larger group.

They were surrounded by Germans for a long period and survived by eating roots and scraps of wild fruit. They were then hidden by locals until they were eventually captured by the Germans.

This speech received a large applause from the crowd and was followed by Mary O'Shea, grandniece of John Finnegan, who stated how her grandmother often spoke of her brother John. Mary concluded by stating that her grandmother would be very proud to see John's name up on the plaque, and a statue of her nephew John Egan just across the road.

Batty Burns read a recitation on World War I. This was followed by the singing of 'The Green Fields of France' by Stephanie Cahill O'Sullivan, supported by Martin Larkin on vocals and Kevin Larkin on bodhrán. As the crowd listened to the words they were reminded of what families went through losing young loved ones. Martin Larkin then sang 'Gallipoli'. The ceremony was concluded by Fr. O'Brien blessing the plaque. The plaque is installed on the building at the corner of Church Street and South Square which was the original site of the old R.I.C barracks.

It's just finished and I can't believe how many people have congratulated us on a "wonderful", "brilliant" festival - I guess it must have been good. Many have gone away saying they are bringing more people back next year and usually they do.

Storytelling in the Barn had to be restricted to 60 this year as we couldn't manage any more. Despite the awful weather 47 people enjoyed our tea and cheese scones. Then up to the barn where this year's teller Frances Kennedy (pictured right) told her fabulous stories. She sang a beautiful rendition of Sean McCarty's song about his sister, "In shame love, in shame".



The Loft hosted a Storytelling Session with Connie Regan-Blake and Killian Burns which was very well attended and Killian is now becoming a master storyteller in his own right.

The Storytelling Concert featured all our tellers plus Cork's John Spillane - it was our biggest audience for this event. The stories came thick and fast and in between John sang his lovely songs. After the concert John took out his guitar in front of the fire in the hotel and we had a session which went on into the early hours.



On Saturday morning the children were entertained by Jay Ryan from PigNut Productions (now on RTEjr). He did two sessions: one for pre-school and the other for primary school children in the Sneem Creche. Our adults, not to be forgotten, were catered for at various times and locations around the village with workshops and storytelling sessions featuring Connie, Frances, and Killian.

This year, our lecturer was John Sheehan from Cork University who spoke about Identity and Heritage on the Iveragh Peninsula. John's interesting lecture gave us much information about the myths and traditions that were attached to ancient monuments in South Kerry, including our area. His lecture was so popular that we had to get extra seats, then turn people away, as we couldn't get any more in.

Batt said he is running out of ideas of titles for his stint in the Blue Bull but who cares! It was a full house and his fans from all over the world happily sat listening to the master. Don't ever ask to stop Batt - we'll be in trouble if you do!

The South Kerry Rosen Choir this time took us on Batt's Tour Around Ireland singing

songs of Dublin, Galway, Clare, Limerick, Cork, and Maidie O'Leary sang 'My Native Sneem'. We finished with the Irish Blessing. Batt told us about the various places we stopped along the way and stories connected to them. We sang to a full house held in the Church of the Transfiguration by kind permission of Reverend Michael Kavanagh.

Our 6 Young Tellers, (sponsored by the Friends of Muckcross), get more popular every year. They had over 100 people in the audience this year as the scouts turned up to see them. These young tellers will be the future of storytelling.

This year's Saturday feature was Fishamble's 'Silent' by Pat Kinevane. An extraordinary performance of a play designed to challenge the audience's perceptions of the world of the homeless. It was harrowing, funny and deeply moving in turn and displayed the awe-inspiring talent of the one-man ensemble and the courage of Batt Burns in scheduling such a difficult piece. 
