Reduced mowing tips: April - Let Dandelions Bee

This month will see the biggest bloom of Dandelions. These native wildflowers are vital sources of nectar and pollen. Records sent to the National Biodiversity Data Centre in 2024 showed that Dandelions were the most popular food source for wild bees. Help feed hungry pollinators this month and #LetDandelionsBee.

Step away from the lawnmower!

Reducing mowing even to once a month can help feed our hungry pollinators. By mowing less, you are giving native wildflowers a chance to pop up naturally. Over time this will result in pockets of species-rich grassland: a vital habitat providing food and shelter for pollinators. If you're taking part in No Mow May this year and you're worried about grass growth, cut your lawn before the end of April. This will ensure the height is manageable when it's time to mow again. Make sure you remove grass clippings to help wildflowers grow. These can be used as mulch around trees or on flower beds. Make sure they don't end up in our waterways as they'll increase the nitrate load.

You can also read a fascinating blog on pollinators.ie, summarising a recent scientific study that shows how 'wiggly' mowing can help pollinators!

New Bee posts



We were delighted to get our 2 new bee poles up on 1st April, one in the pollinator bed in the North Square and one in the Garden of the Senses. They were supplied by the Irish Bee Conservation Project and purchased with some of our Pollinator Award winnings. The purpose of these poles is to provide nesting sites for the cavity nesting solitary bees such as leafcutter bees or mason bees. Keep an eye on the holes in the sides of the posts

and if they are stuffed with clay or leaves, this means that the queen has laid her eggs in the cavity. Each egg is supplied with a pollen and nectar food source so when the larvae hatch, it has something to eat. The new bees will eventually emerge from the holes and then they will need pollinator friendly flowers to feed on, which is why we erected the poles in the pollinator bed and the Garden of the Senses.

Pollinator Patches - leave a space for wildlife in your garden

- let the grass grow - dandelions are an important food for emerging bees.
- plant a native tree/hedge - willow is especially important for insects
- put in a mini-pond, even a basin with stones and a native mint or other water plant greatly helps wildlife in your garden
- don't use pesticides/herbicides

Pollinator Friendly Weedkiller

- One litre white vinegar (extra strong available in Galvin's)
- One cup of diluted Epsom Salts (available in Sneem Pharmacy)
- A squirt of washing up liquid.

Spray onto weeds on a still dry day. This has been tested and it works.

Kenmare and District Garden Club

The KDGC met on the 3rd April and our speaker was Lee Behagan who works in the gardens at Lismore with Colm O'Driscoll (of RTE's Home Grown fame).

Lee's career as a gardener has included internships in the Chanticleer garden which is just outside Philadelphia. It is a contemporary garden where work began in the 1990's in what had been a privately owned property.

Of Chanticleer's 50 acres, 35 are open to the public. The climate ranges from very hot and often humid summers to extremely cold winters and there are a range of soil types. These conditions, along with a large, enthusiastic staff has allowed Chanticleer to be creative and experimental in its approach. There are several gardens within the boundaries including a Teacup garden which has a different theme each year; the Tennis Court garden, which was the first to be developed in the '90's, and a Pond garden which was created in response to a damp, flood prone area.

Chanticleer's dynamic and experimental approach includes many 'movable' elements such as floating arrangements in large pots and much container planting. Inspiration has been taken from many sources within North America and from around the world. Lee's beautiful photos allowed us a glimpse of the fascinating range of planting and design that Chanticleer offers.
