The Beavers did a lot of adventuring, with a hike in Parknasilla followed by some zip-line and playground fun. They also had a firelighting session with flint and steel to build further confidence and backwoods skills. A second hike from Clashnacree to Sneem featured K-pop singing along the way to keep spirits high!

Their Christmas party to end the term was also a great success, with a snowball fight using rolled up newspapers, campfire carols, and hot chocolate. It was a fantastic end to a brilliant year.

and then continue hiking the next day to their destination. The Scouts are looking to do the hiking part autonomously so will be working on their map reading and navigation skills in preparation.

Our Ventures meanwhile have been having the time of their lives at the annual Venture Ball, this year held in the ballroom of the Clayton Springs Hotel in Cork. The theme was 'enchanted realms', with 480 Ventures present from all around the country. Our Ventures were very well dressed in their magical attire, and great time was had by all.

The Ventures also recently completed a self-led hike from Kenmare to Templenoe. During the planning for their hike they learnt how to plan a safe and fun outing, and learnt how to make a routecard.

The Beavers have also been practicing for outdoors activities, by practicing packing a bag for a camp. They had great fun doing sack races using their sleeping bags too.

They also did some great challenge activities in the woods at Parknasilla. They were split into two groups and were tasked with leaving a woodland trail for the other group to follow. The groups took turns hiding in the woods and practiced being still, quiet and camouflaged (with their torches off!) while the other group used their detective skills to find the trail.





We also got to enjoy the spectacular night sky and a couple of shooting stars! The Beavers did great work, trying out something new and braving the dark, to really listen and take in everything happening around them.

Sneem Community First Responders



A Community Supporting Itself

We are delighted to confirm that Sneem Community First Responders (Sneem CFR) has now formally registered as a charity and officially went live over the Christmas period. Since Christmas week, a dedicated team of seven local volunteers has already responded to a number of emergency callouts, providing vital early medical support within our community while awaiting the arrival of the National Ambulance Service. This rapid response can make a real difference in critical situations and reflects a strong commitment from local people to look after their own.

While the service is entirely volunteer led, it does come with significant and ongoing costs. It costs approximately €2,500 to fully kit out a single responder, and with seven active responders this represents a substantial initial investment. This figure does not include the cost of essential training equipment, ongoing refresher training, or the replacement of time-critical medical supplies, all of which are necessary to keep the service safe, effective, and compliant.

We would also like to sincerely thank the Sneem community and local businesses for the incredible support shown so far, including:

- Circa €900 raised from the Christmas Day Swim at Parknasilla Hotel, organised by D. O'Shea's Bar.
- Over €400 raised from the Sneem 12 Pubs of Christmas night
- Scrap metal collection, with the final amount still to be confirmed.

We are especially grateful to Sneem Pharmacy for their generous support in sponsoring the medical response bags used by our volunteers. We would also like to thank Kieran Casey Electrical (Oysterbed) for kindly sponsoring the team's uniforms.

These efforts demonstrate what can be achieved when a community comes together with a shared purpose. On behalf of the entire Sneem CFR team, thank you for the encouragement, generosity, and belief in this service. This is a community-led initiative—built by local people, for local people.

Litter Bins

It has come to our attention that, despite our recent article, asking people to desist from putting household rubbish into the street litter bins, some people are still doing it. This practice is illegal and a reportable offence. Under the Litter and Pollution Act in Ireland, this is considered illegal dumping, which can result in on-the-spot fines of up to €150 or convictions with maximum fines of €3,000 in court. There is no excuse for this practice as household waste and recycling bags are available in D.J. O'Sullivan's (Hilary's), Costcutters and Mace. A general waste bag costs €5 and a bag for recycling costs €3. There is a trailer in Seaview 6 days a week for filled bags and the CE team works hard emptying the bins and the trailer. The photograph was taken on 3rd January, this is not a good look for our lovely village especially as we want to keep our gold medal this year.

Lions Clubs International sponsor a worldwide collection and distribution of used spectacles to third world countries where the recipients are not interested in the fashion statement of the frames, but in the lenses to let them have sight.

The World Health Organization estimate that more than 150 million people have uncorrected refractive errors (near-sightedness, far-sightedness or astigmatism). Most of these vision impairments are quickly diagnosed and easy to treat with corrective lenses.

Still, millions of people in developing nations are pushed deeper into poverty simply because they don't have glasses. They can't learn, because reading is difficult. They can't work to the best of their ability, because they can't see clearly. For children, clear vision means a better education, healthier development and a better quality of life. For adults, it means greater employment opportunity and economic strength. For seniors it means less dependence on others.

We the Lions of District 133 Ireland collect and recycle tens of thousands of spectacles each year for distribution to the Third World. The lenses are most important and if the frames are intact that is an added bonus. Spectacle cases in good condition are very welcome. Spectacles collected by the Lions Clubs of District 133 Ireland are transported to Medico Lions Clubs de France in Le Havre for sorting and grading before shipping to third world countries.
