Members of the Sneem Craft Group have once again demonstrated the power of community spirit through a heartfelt initiative supporting local emergency services.

The group, who meet every Wednesday from 11am to 1pm at the Bookshop in Sneem, have lovingly created a collection of handmade trauma toys, knitted and crocheted especially for use by the Sneem Fire Brigade.

Each toy bears the name of one of the local firemen and will be carried on fire appliances to help comfort children involved in traumatic incidents attended by the brigade. The toys are intended to provide reassurance and a small source of comfort during what can be extremely distressing situations.

The presentation took place at Sneem Fire Station on Tuesday, 24th February, where Michele, Kathy and Una met with members of the fire brigade to formally hand over the toys. Fellow knitters Maggie, Ena and Kate, who also contributed to the project, were unable to attend on the day. The group is now continuing their efforts by creating additional trauma toys for the Sneem Community First Responders.

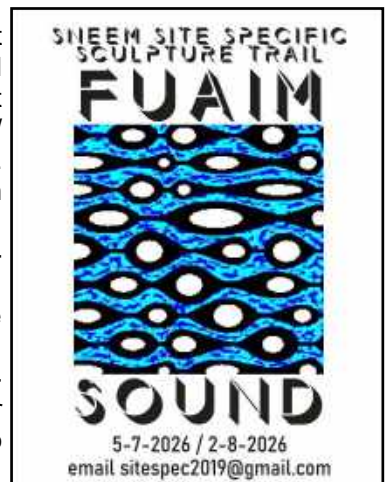
