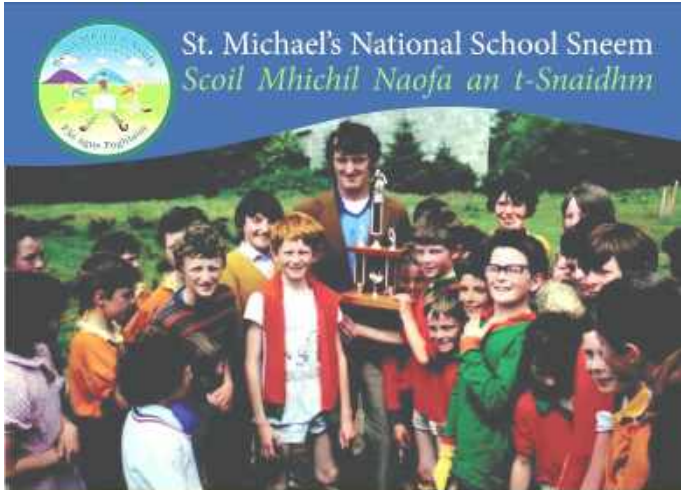
Book Launch Invitation

South Kerry Destination and Experience Development Plan



Putting Sneem at the Heart of South Kerry's Future: The Valentia Island Update

In the April and May Newsletters, we introduced you to the **DEDP** (Destination and Experience Development Plan)—the medium- and long-term strategy being created by Fáilte Ireland and sustainability experts to shape the future of South Kerry.

As we mentioned before, this project focuses on four pillars: **V**isitors, **I**ndustry (local businesses), the **C**ommunity, and the **E**nvironment. Ultimately, the goal is to make South Kerry a better place to live and work, not just a place to visit.

Things are moving quickly. On Tuesday, April 28th, Fergal Harrington (Álaid Walk-ing), Pdraig Burns (Sneem Digital Hub), Nicola Duggan (Sneem Hotel) attended the Royal Hotel on Valentia Island to represent our village at a major full-day Stakeholder Forum.

Brainstorming with "Roses, Buds, and Thorns"

The forum brought together 50 to 60 community representatives from all across the Iveragh Peninsula, alongside senior managers from Fáilte Ireland and tourism consultants.

To kick off the discussions the organizers used a brainstorming exercise called "**Roses, Buds, and Thorns.**" With so many different perspectives in the room, it generated a massive number of ideas. Here is how we broke it down:

- **Roses (The Highlights):** The positive elements and existing strengths we already enjoy in our communities, like our unique landscape, coastal heritage, and dark skies.
- **Thorns (The Challenges):** The real-world struggles and roadblocks we face. We didn't shy away from the tough topics, raising critical issues like infrastructure deficits and housing shortages.
- **Buds (The Opportunities):** The areas with major potential for growth and improvement—the new, creative ideas that can be developed to make the peninsula better for everyone.

What Are the Next Steps?

Having dozens of people pitching ideas at once meant a huge amount of information was collected. Right now, the consultants are assessing, sorting, and grouping all of these contributions together.

All of this local feedback will directly inform the actual strategy. The team is currently working hard behind the scenes, and the first official draft of the South Kerry DEDP is expected to be ready by **September**.

Looking Ahead to Autumn

We want to ensure the Sneem community is actively involved in this process. Our main job is to make sure our village's unique needs are firmly at the center of this strategy so that future investment and support land where they matter most.

While the planning team drafts the document over the summer months, we will keep you updated. Look out for the early autumn editions of the newsletter, where we expect to share the first look at the draft plan and what it means for the future of Sneem! By Fergal Harrington

Huge News for the Sneem Story House!

We have some absolutely brilliant news to share! We've just been approved for a **€25,000 grant** from the Heritage Council's Community Heritage Grant Scheme to help restore the old 1810 Little Church.

To give you an idea of how big this is: 375 groups across Ireland applied for this funding, and we were one of just 127 chosen. This cash injection comes right on top of the **€11,000** we already secured from the Built Heritage Scheme, giving us a massive boost to get things

moving.

What's Happening Next?

Our conservation architect, Karol O'Mahony, along with Niall Scott and the Sneem Story House Committee, are currently looking for the perfect contractors to take on the much-needed work.

Here is what we're tackling first:

- Giving the vestibule (the entrance area) a proper cleanup.
- Installing a brand-new, weatherproof church door to keep the elements out.
- Removing the old porch.
- Improving access so the building is easy for everyone to get into.

We honestly can't wait to see the builders get started soon, and we owe a huge thank you to everyone who has backed the project so far.

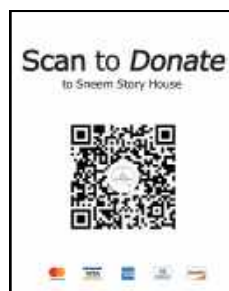

Local Authority Waters Programme (LAWPRO)

The Senior Room were delighted to welcome Bláthnaid from LAWPRO. Bláthnaid works on behalf of Ireland's local authorities to protect and improve water quality. The original plan was to explore Sneem River but unfortunately the rain was more than plentiful which resulted in a dangerously high river! Alternatively we explored the area near The Pyramids and Bláthnaid brought water samples she had collected earlier. Pupils investigated the samples for aquatic insects to determine if the river was clean or not. A number of stoneflies were identified. Stonefly nymphs are strictly aquatic and occur in every kind of unpolluted stream with an abundance of oxygen. Bláthnaid spoke about biodiversity and encouraged the pupils to explore the area for plant life, fish, birds and all things interdependent. Thank you to Jane O'Sullivan for organising Bláthnaid's visit.

OVERALL VERDICT: Sneem River is in tip top ecological condition, both clean and flourishing!

No Mow May

We are incredibly grateful to all those who supported No Mow May. It has resulted in lots of new mini meadows emerging across the village. Our orchid popped up in the Garden of the Senses for the 3rd year! No Mow May is over, but that doesn't mean you have to start cutting regularly again. Mowing less from April until September is one of the best ways you can help pollinators. So why not keep the buzz going with #LetItBloomJune?



Cutting once a month rather than every couple of weeks, and removing the grass clippings when you do mow, can help native wildflowers like Red and White Clover, Self-heal and Birds-foot-trefoil appear.

Create a short-flowering meadow

By mowing just once a month, you can give native wildflowers and insect friendly grasses a chance to pop up naturally and help feed hungry wild bees. No seeds needed!



April:

#Let Dandelions Bee



When you mow, make sure you remove grass clippings so wildflowers can grow.

May:

#No Mow May



June:

#Let it Bloom June



Be creative when you mow! Cut pathways, spirals, and shapes.

July:

#Help Them Fly July



August:

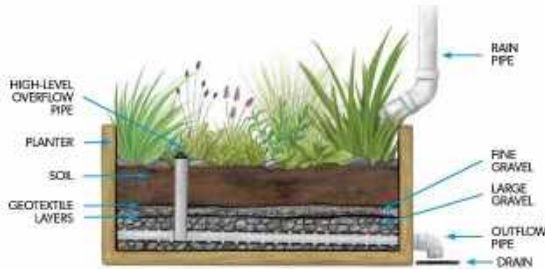
If your grass gets too tall at any stage, trim it with blades raised high to save the wildflowers. Leave some corners to grow long.

New Rainwater Planters

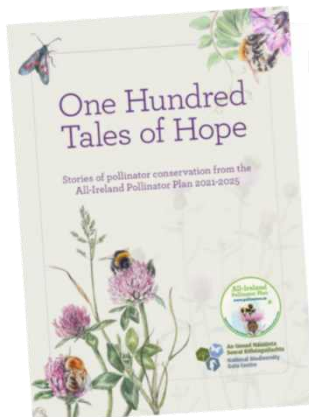

Thanks also to Joe and the CE team for connecting up and filling these planters for us and Cara and Eimear (who was on work placement with us) for planting them with locally sourced native plants. The idea behind the rainwater planters is to slow the flow of water coming off roofs during a downpour and filter it slowly into the drains.

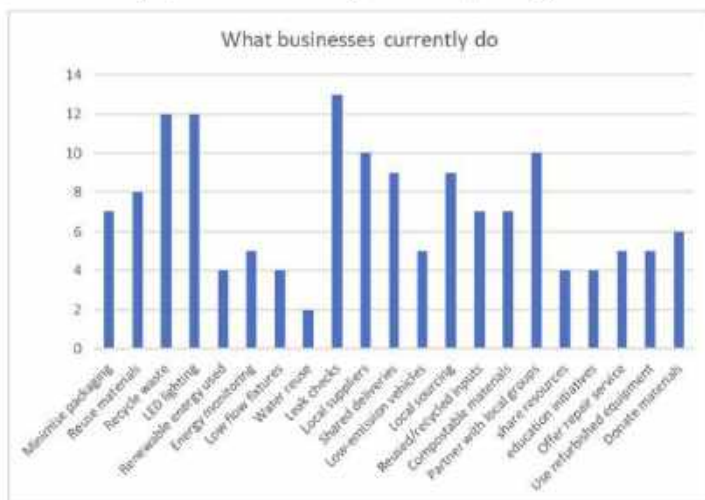

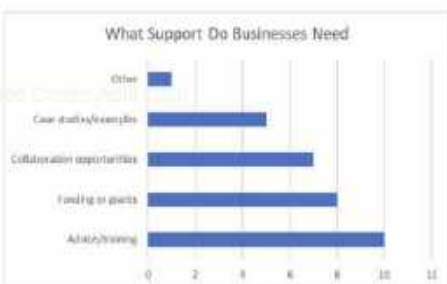
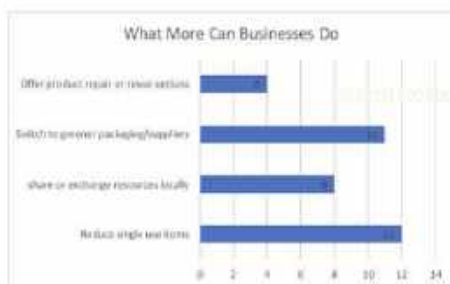


Circular Economy Business Survey

In April, we created a Circular Economy Survey for local businesses and the Senior Room pupils from Sneem National School took a business each and filled out the survey with them. In total 19 businesses were surveyed - the majority of shops in Sneem. The survey was divided into 3 sections: What businesses currently do; What more can they do and Support they need.



Section 1: What businesses currently do; this examined the areas of waste reduction; Energy efficiency; Water use; Transport and Logistics; Products and Materials; Community and collaboration; Repair and reuse with 3 questions in each section. The majority of businesses recycle waste, use LED lighting, check for water leaks, use local suppliers and share deliveries and partner with local groups.



Section 2: What More Can Businesses Do - most retail businesses were keen to switch to greener packaging and reduce single use items. Getting rid of single use coffee cups was mentioned in a number of the comments with one cafe planning to introduce the Go Cups.

Section 3: What Support Do Businesses Need - businesses were particularly interested in funding or grants to implement new initiatives with one commenting "Show me the money and the greener I become!!"

We would like to thank all the students and businesses who took part in this survey. The results were included in our TidyTowns Entry form which was submitted in May.
